1. <u>WELCOME</u>

1.1 The Chairman, Mr Neville Clarence, welcomed all persons attending the Annual General Meeting.

3. <u>CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS ANNUAL GENERAL</u> <u>MEETING DATED 18TH MARCH 2005</u>

3.1 There being no matters arising were proposed by Neville Davies of Western Province and seconded by Rob Rowles from Eastern Province.

4. <u>PRESIDENT'S REPORT</u>

- 4.1 No electronic copy available.
- 4.2 There being no matters arising acceptance was proposed by Rob Rowles of Eastern Province and seconded by Neville Davies of Western Province.

5. <u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u>

- 5.1 Neville Clarence presented the treasurer's report.
- 5.2 The financial report was still at the auditors being finalised, however, the salient points are:

5.2.1 Expenses included:

- Replaced one set of caps.
- 5.2.2 Income:

- There was a very late (previous week) payment from Border for the 2005 Masters tournament.
- Provinces were reminded that they should not leave tournament payments to such a late degree.
- SA Masters are in a sound financial state and thus could absolve Border's late payment.
- 5.3 Future expenses
 - Need to replace the other two sets.
 - The old sets that have been replaced will be donated to a worthy school.
- 5.4 Acceptance was proposed by Mike Samuel of Natal and seconded by Steve Douglas of SWD.

6. <u>NOMINATIONS FOR NEW OFFICE BEARERS</u>

- 6.2 Neville Clarence (*) indicated that the 2006-2007 term would be his last as he had now been in the chair for 10 years.
- 6.3 At the 2007 AGM, a new chairman will have to be selected and provinces were asked to consider who they would propose for this role.
- 6.4 Updated details of provincial representatives are attached hereto.

7. SOUTH AFRICAN MASTERS WATER POLO CHAMPIONSHIPS 2007

- 7.1 Criteria for hosting SA Masters was again emphasised
 - Ideally three (3) pools at the same venue.
 - Venues satisfying the above are Durban, Cape Town, East London & Knysna.
- 7.2 Neville Davies (Western Province) stated that they had not discussed the option of hosting the 2007 SA Masters and thus would not be submitting a bid.
- 7.3 Two bids were considered.
 - South Western Districts to host at Knysna.
 - Border to host at East London

- 7.4 East London bid proposal. (Done in abstention. Border arrived after the award had been done)
- 7.4.1 Neville Clarence stated that East London have gained experience from past Masters tournaments and that they have always put up a good tournament.
- 7.4.2 SA Masters is satisfied that they are capable of hosting the 2007 tournament.
- 7.5 South Western Districts bid proposal
- 7.5.1 Knysna cannot control the temperature of the water and as thus it is not seen as an issue.
- 7.5.2 Fifty five (55) kids in the Knysna area have started to play water polo who are trained and assisted by SWD Masters players.
- 7.5.3 SWD have the backing of the Knysna Tourism Department as well local restaurants and establishments in the area to host the tournament.
- 7.5.4 The restaurant owner of 34° South is supportive of the bid but has some concerns with what happened in 2001.
- 7.5.5 SWD promise a better tournament than in 2001.
- 7.5.6 Issues / Queries from Provincial representatives

Neville Davies - Western Province

- Overall happiness of all the players playing conditions were not the greatest.
- What do the players get out of it?
- Knysna is at the wrong end of the world.
- Wish to note the sacrifice of water temperature.

Neville Clarence – Central Gauteng.

- CG have a quorum from their players to support SWD.
- CG will in all essence submit thirteen (13) teams.
- Need a break from East London.

Ian van Zyl – Eastern Gauteng.

- Some players ended up with ear, nose & throat infections from the water.
- Request that restaurants cater for late revellers.

Mike Samuel – Natal.

- If the weather turns bad, Knysna is not a happy place.
- Emphasise that it must then be a good Masters tournament.

Warrick Smith – Zimbabwe.

- Limited spectator visibility.
- 7.6 Voting.
- 7.6.1 Knysna in favour 6, against 2
- 7.6.2 East London no votes

- 7.6.3 Thus, by majority vote, the 2007 SA Masters Water Polo tournament will be hosted by South Western Districts in Knysna.
- 7.6.4 SWD to supply dates of the 2007 tournament.

8. <u>GENERAL</u>

- 8.1 Zimbabwe asked for a possible extension to host the tournament over three (3) days instead of two (2) for a venue with only two (2) pools.
- 8.1.1 Neville Clarence stated that Zimbabwe should do the calculations and submit a proposal for consideration.
- 8.2 Age groupings.
- 8.2.1 The 25, 35 and 45 age groups adopted in 2003 has not faired very well as was evidence in the lead up to the 2006 tournament.
- 8.2.2 A proposal was put forward to re-align the age groups to over 30, over 40 and over 50 year groupings.
- 8.2.3 Easterns raised the problem of the *quality* of players available to play in the different age groups.
- 8.2.4 The standard age grouping rule would still apply:- the average age of the seven (7) youngest players in a team will determine which section they qualify to play in.
- 8.2.5 If a team felt that they could not play in that section due to the *quality* of their players, they could make a request to the tournament organisers to be accommodated in another section.
- 8.2.6 The tournament organisers in conjunction with the SA Masters chairman would consider the team's request to be accommodated in another section and advise them of the outcome.
- 8.2.7 Voting on the over 30, over 40 and over 50 age groupings
 - In favour 9
 - Against 0
 - Abstentions 0
- 8.2.8 The 2007 tournament would adopt the new age groupings of over 30, over 40 and over 50.
- 8.3 The disciplinary committee would consist of:
 - A provincial representative not the province(s) involved
 - The chairman of SA Masters Water Polo
 - The referee from the game concerned
- 8.4 The Paul Semple Shield of deceased players was to be updated. Provinces to please forward via email the names of deceased players to John Wells (janputte@gmail.com) for inclusion on the web site.
- 8.5 Neville Clarence thanked John & Marilyn Wells for all their hard work in setting up and maintaining a great web site in leading up to the 2006 tournament.

- 8.6 Natal have arranged for an official photographer to take photos during the tournament. Please visit their website for details <u>www.bigdot.co.za</u>
- 8.7 Referees for the games would be nominated as follows:
- 8.7.1 Referees are to come from the water (players) ideally the previous game.
- 8.7.2 It was stated the game should be referred at the level that the game is played at not at International level but rather at Masters or club league level.
- 8.7.3 The game must be referred within the FINA rules of the game but keeping with the spirit of Masters.
- 8.7.4 The hosting province would provide referees for the first event.
- 8.8 Trophy winners see attached schedule.

9.1 The date of the next Annual General Meeting is to be arranged.
